The Breakfast Club has since become a vital part of our school, providing a welcoming space for our students to start their day with a healthy meal.

In 2023, we faced a new challenge—the need for a fridge-freezer to safely store our food supplies. Once again, our community stepped up to support us. **Mandurah Muscateers**, **Mandurah Murray Mayday Inc.**, and **Robyn Clarke**, **MLA** generously provided the necessary funding, helping us keep the Breakfast Club running smoothly.

Following the refurbishment of our canteen by ALCOA, we entered 2024 with a new goal in mind: to weatherproof our outdoor eating area, making it a comfortable space for both dining and learning. Thanks to the combined efforts of Mandurah Murray Mayday Inc., the Bendigo Community Grant, ALCOA, Doral Mineral Sands, and Bunnings, we were able to install outdoor blinds by the end of Term 2, creating a more welcoming and functional area for our students and staff.

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

YEAR 6 VISIT TO PARLIAMENT HOUSE - TUESDAY 5TH NOVEMBER

As part of their HASS studies the Year 6 students will be going to Parliament House in Harvest Terrace, Perth on Tuesday 5th of November.

This will give the students an opportunity to view parliament in action and

- Understand that the key institutions of Australia's democratic system of government are based on the Westminster system.
- Understand the two houses of state Parliament, the passage of legislation and their elected members
- Understand the bicameral system
- Composition and roles of both houses
- Difference between electoral districts and regions
- The main roles of a Member of Parliament

Students will travel to and from the venue by bus, departing North Dandalup at 9.00am and returning by 3.00pm.

Students are required to wear school uniform and closed in shoes and bring their recess, lunch and a drink bottle in their school bag. School bags will remain on the bus during the day.

Students will receive a guided tour of Parliament House by a Parliamentary Education Office. Students will receive a snack and drink once the tour in completed.

Students will be supervised on the day by Mr Black and Mr Clark.

The cost for this excursion is \$25 each.


